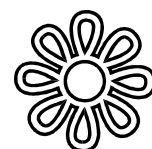
ANZAC ANNUAL POPPY APPEAL 2010

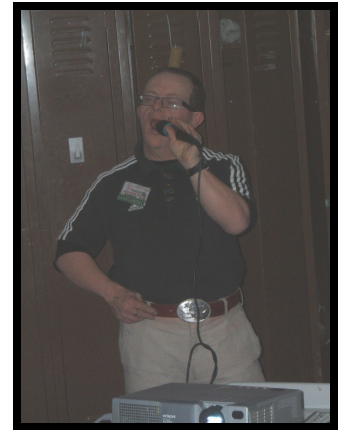
